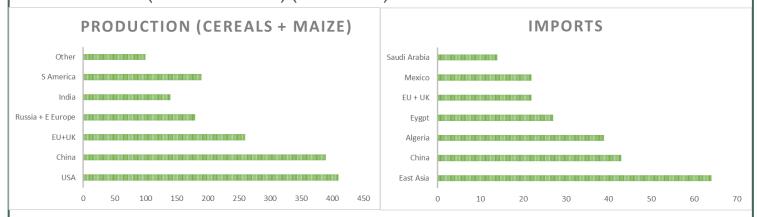
#### Overview

What drives our grain markets? As a global player the UK is relatively minor – China often has variations in their grain production figures bigger than our whole harvest however we are obviously important in our home market. Where do we sit in the whole order of things, where do our cereals go and who are the big markets outside domestic demand. The charts below should give some guides – some are surprising eg amount of wheat used for Human feed.
