May - The Month for Growth

Keep Lambs Thriving

- Boost Growth with Cobalt:
 - Superstock Ewe & Lamb one of the highest spec'd buckets available

Look after the Cattle

Arable Update – May

Comments

Phew... a reprieve at last. Lots of activity from the middle of April catching up on fertiliser, weed control and field activities.

Cereals

- Cereal prices have rallied recently prices are nearly at £200/t for November. Even though crops in some cases are shy of tillers, it will still pay to look after them. A good quality flag leaf spray will protect your yield by maintaining green leaf area. There are a few new fungicide options this year including Jessico One + Vimoy and Questar + Velogy. These products are really pushing Septoria and Yellow Rust control up several notches. Talk to your agronomist about where they fit in your crops.
- There are milling premiums of over £50/t in the market. If you are growing Grp1 wheats eg Crusoe, Skyfall or some Group 2s e.g. Extase, Palladium then it will be well worth looking at a late N application when ears have emerged. This can be either a foliar product or granular (in which case apply at ear emergence to allow time for the N to be taken up).

OSR

- Flowering is gradually declining in crops as pod formation and development take over. Keep inspecting pods for holes and damage.
- A late dose of nitrogen will enhance oil content (oil bonus is worth1.5% of sale value for every 1% oil over 40%)

Spring Crops

Spring crops will rocket through their growth stages as it warms and given the soil moisture. Managing tiller numbers is especially important this year as the season is so late. Early growth regulator will help reduce apical dominance and keep tillers alive. Contrary to lots of opinions growth regulators will, in a lot of cases, increase straw volume even if overall crop height is reduced. Products such as **Adjust** and **Alatrin Evo** are very crop kind and will have positive impacts on a crops performance.
