

Following a trial by the University of Glasgow School of Veterinary Medicine, lambs supplemented with **Essential Lamb Boluses** achieved an increased **daily live weight gain** of **49g per day** when compared with un-supplemented lambs.

Arable Update - June

Comments

Given the lack of access to many crops this spring, it does seem strange that for a lot of crops the inputs are nearly all over (OSR, Winter Cereals). Spring crops are rapidly growing away and will take some keeping up with.

Cereals

- Flag Leaf or T2 sprays are nearly over for most people. Dependent on weather conditions, end use and disease pressure an ear wash may be required. This can help protect quality and yield through the long window from June to Harvest. CC Vulture in wheat is the best option to help with Fusarium and late ear diseases.
- Just a reminder that milling premiums are available on Group 1s and some Group 2s. Foliar N on good crops can add significant value to your crops

OSR

• Keep yours eyes open for late pod midge damage

Spring Crops

- Spring Barleys are already at T1 timing (1st Node) and are romping away. Ramularia is likely to be a big threat this year so the addition of Phoenix (Folpet) will be really useful.
- Beet and maize weed control, if not already completed will be priorities to ensure crops don't suffer competition.
- The addition of PhysioN to beet and maize crops at
 6 8 leaf stage has real benefits on crop green leaf protection and final yield.

Technical Corner: What should my wheat crop look like?

The following is data from the AHDB to describe the optimum targets for a wheat crop at flowering (early/mid June). Obviously after this season not all crops will be at these targets – some may be better, some may be below target.

Fertile Shoots	460/m2
Roots	1000kg/ha (31km/m3)
Nitrogen use to date	248kgN/ha
GAI (green leaf area)	6.3
Above ground Kg/DM	12.1t/ha
Growth rate	180kg/ha/day
Height to base of ear	690mm
Stem weight Kg/DM	7.1t/ha
Ear weight Kg/DM	1.9t/ha
Grain number/ear	48

The crop will utilise another 30lgN/Ha between now and harvest. The crop is currently at about 65% of its total final yield (straw, chaff and grain).

Seed
