### **Comments**

Not much to comment on this month other than harvest is coming off reasonably well currently and the weather has changed just when it needed to keep dry!

#### **Fodder Beet**

If you haven't applied a fungicide yet then it would be well worth applying one to your beet. **Angle** will keep you beet leaves greener longer which builds yield and helps overcome frost damage. Combined with **Magnesium** and late **nitrogen** your beet has the best chance of maximising yield over the winter and into the new year.

Palladium Grp2, 102% yield, 6 standing, very good disease profile, spec weights 75.6kg

**Champion** Grp4 hard, 107.5% yield, 4 standing needs PGR, very good disease profile, spec weights 77.7kg Grp4 hard, 105.6% yield, 5 standing needs PGR, very good disease profile, spec weights 74.5kg

Worth a punt Bamford

#### **Barley**

Caravelle 2 row, 103.5% yield, 7 standing, decent disease profile, high spec weight 71.4kg

Belfry 6 row, 104% yield, 7 standing, decent disease profile, avg. spec weight 68kg

Kingsbarn 6 row, 106.3% yield, 6 standing, decent disease profile, high spec weight 70.2kg
